Any problems with your collection must be reported TO THE MORRIS COUNTY MUA before 10:00 am on the Monday morning following the collection day at the above phone number.

We encourage residents to put recyclables at curbside the night before, but they must be there **BEFORE 6:00 am.**

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD BOXES MUST BE EMPTY AND FLAT. IF THEY ARE TOO BIG TO FIT IN YOUR CONTAINER, STACK THE FLATTENED BOXES INTO ONE UNFLATTENED BOX AND PLACE IT NEXT TO YOUR CONTAINER.

SINGLE-STREAM
all-in-one
RECYCLING

The Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority "all-in-one," single-stream recycling collection program allows cans, bottles, cardboard and all other paper to be mixed together for recycling. All of these items can go into one recycling container.

All items must be empty and free of food residue.

Paper Recycle office paper, file folders, junk mail, envelopes, flyers, newspapers and inserts, magazines, catalogs, paperbacks and phone books, wrapping paper, paper bags, tissue and cookie boxes, paper towel cores, toilet tissue rolls, frozen food boxes, cartons and boxes used for milk, juice, soup, broth, etc., clean pizza boxes, 6-pack and 12-pack cartons from soda, clean paper ice cream containers. Corrugated cardboard must be flattened. (**Shredded paper - see below)

Plastic Recycle plastic containers (bottles and non-bottles) coded 1 2 4 5 7
 Plastic caps and lids larger than 3" in diameter are acceptable*. The smallest acceptable plastic container is a 6- to 8-ounce yogurt cup*. Containers must be empty.

Metal Recycle aluminum and steel (tin) cans, loose metal jar lids, steel bottle caps, clean aluminum foil, pie plates and trays. Containers must be empty.

Glass Recycle glass bottles and jars with caps and lids removed. Recycle loose metal caps and lids. Bottles and jars must be empty.

Do not recycle plastics coded 3 6
 V PS

- No liquids
- No garbage
- * No plastic items smaller than 6- to 8-ounce yogurt cups; for example, do not recycle small plastic caps or pill bottles.
- No VHS/VCR tapes
- No hangers
- No hardcover books
- No flower pots or trays
- No window panes, mirrors, glass vases, ceramics, or Pyrex® dishware
- No stickers or address label sheet waste
- No plastics other than those listed
- No metal other than what is listed
- No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)
- No paint, pesticides, oil & cleaners
- No plant material or food waste
- No waxed paper or waxed cardboard

Important

- * Recycling containers must not exceed 50 pounds. 32-gallon containers are recommended.
- * Only use plastic bags for shredded paper. All other material must be loose in a container, not in a bag.
- * Do not tie cardboard or newspapers, put in reusable containers loose, or stack folded boxes into one box.
- * Label your recycling containers with free decals from your town or the MCMUA.
- * Put all Styrofoam into the trash; it's coded #6 and is not acceptable for recycling.

- No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers
- No motor oil or anti-freeze containers
- ** No plastic bags other than for shredded paper
- ** No loose shredded paper
- ** Shredded paper must be in clear plastic bags. Nothing else should be in a plastic bag except for shredded paper. Shred only confidential information.

2016 ADDITIONAL MANDATED RECYCLED MATERIALS FOR MORRIS COUNTY



Appliances: Composed predominantly of metal. Picked up at curbside the 2nd Wednesday of the month by Chatham Disposal 973-379-1268. Appliances containing **FREON MUST HAVE IT REMOVED BY A LICENSED COMPANY** and **ISSUED A STATE STICKER** approving removal or the appliance will **NOT** be picked up. For Freon removal: Morris Co. Appliance 973-538-4348, ATV, Inc. 973-277-7108, Ideal Refrigeration 973-539-0289, Par-Troy Sheet Metal & AC 973-227-1150 and Midland Appliance Center 973-366-3383. Economy Appliance 973-635-5665. **Refrigerator-Freezer Recycling Program:** Call JACO Environmental for free removal of working appliance 1-877-270-3520 or visit www.NJCleanEnergy.com. Participants will receive a \$50 rebate. **Microwaves, dehumidifiers or water cooler** call your disposal company.

Batteries: Nickel Cadmium (Ni-CD), Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH), Lithium Ion (Li-Ion), Nickel Zinc (Ni-Zn), Small Sealed Lead (SSLA/PB) are considered household hazardous waste and are found in cellular & cordless phones, laptops, cameras, remote controls, toys and cordless tools. Dispose of at Household Hazardous Waste Center or drop off events. Places accepting rechargeable batteries: Verizon Wireless, Lowe's, Radio Shack and Home Depot. Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006 accepts rechargeable and button batteries.

Cell Batteries: (alkaline and carbon zinc dry cell AAA, AA, C, D, AND 9V) are no long considered hazardous. They may be thrown in the garbage.

Lead Acid Batteries: (car, boats, campers, etc.): Contact the Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006 or www.mcmua.com for drop off sites..

Compost Material: Branches, brush, grass and leaves may be taken to the Tanglewood Lane Compost site. Call 973-377-5114 or go to www.chathamtownship-nj.gov for information. No curbside pickup available.

Electronics: Computers, Monitors, TV's, Printers, Fax, etc. Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006. Check your local Staples 973-236-0800, Best Buy 973-515-4994 (will pickup for a fee), Reconnect (Goodwill) 973-912-0156 for a list of what they recycle, 1-800-Got-Junk or Harding Twp Depot 973-267-2448 for appointment.

Motor Oil (Used): Private service stations or Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006.

Oil-Contaminated Soil: Bayshore Recycling 732-738-6000, Clean Earth 732-541-8909.

Stumps: www.mcmua.com see Home page "A-Z" pull down the list and go to Materials Waste/Recycling – Stumps.

Whole Tires: Chatham Township Department of Public Works \$2.00 per tire 973-377-5114. Not on rim.

MISCELLANEOUS MATERIALS

Bulk Material: Call your garbage disposal company. Condo's/Townhouses call your management company.

Carpets/Padding: Carpet Cycle 973-732-4858. Location is Newark. Carpet and padding must be dry for pickup.

Cell Phones: Great Swamp Outdoor Center 973-635-6629, Staples, Best Buy, Home Depot, and Electronic stores.

Christmas Trees: When open, drop off trees at the Tanglewood Lane Recycling or check with your garbage hauler.

Concrete/Asphalt: www.mcmua.com see Home page "A-Z" pull down the list and go to Materials Waste/Recycling.

Fluorescent Light Bulbs, Ballasts, Mercury Switches & Thermostats: Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006 .Parsippany Home Depot will take fluorescent bulbs and CFL's. 973-335-5917.

Helium Tanks: Party size drop off at House Hold Hazardous Waste facility or events.

Household Hazardous Waste Material: Call 973-829-8006 for disposal instructions or visit www.mcmua.com

Ink Printer/Toner Cartridges: Drop off sites: Office supply stores, Staples, Office Depot, Best Buy & Cartridge World.

Large Rigid Plastics : Can only be dropped off at the Tanglewood Lane Recycling Depot. For information of acceptable items go to www.chathamtownship-nj.gov . "Recycling"

Latex Paint: For partially full can add Kitty litter or shredded paper, stir and let dry completely. Put in regular trash with lid off. If the can is full pour excess in another can and follow the preceding instructions.

Medications: For disposal instructions: www.mcmua.com Solid Waste –Hazardous Waste Materials - Medical Waste. Watch for Police drop off days in local papers. Chatham Township Police Mon-Fri 10 am - 6 pm, 401 Southern Blvd. For information and other drop off times call 973-377-0100 or www.ctpd.net .

Morris Habitat for Humanity ReStore: Reuses, Recycles & Resells building materials, tools, furniture, appliances & household items. For information, to donate items, shop or volunteer call 973-366-3358 or go to www.morrisrestore.org

Paint (Oil based): Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006.

Smoke/Carbon Monoxide Detectors: Follow the manufacturer's return instructions or go to www.mcmua.com Solid Waste-Hazardous Waste-Smoke Detectors. If no other option exists remove only the battery and dispose of in the trash.

Styrofoam: Foam Pack Industries, Springfield 973-376-3700.

Syringes: www.mcmua.com Solid Waste –Hazardous Waste Materials - Medical Waste. Morristown Memorial Hospital 973-971-4177 or St. Clare's Hospital (Denville or Dover) drop of at front desk in a hardened sealed container or "Sharps Disposal by Mail" 877-WASTE-MD for information.

Used Clothing: Market Street Mission and Amvets collection boxes are at the Tanglewood Lane Recycling Depot. All clothing must be placed in plastic bags or the items will be discarded.

**To find out if Recycling Curbside Collection has been cancelled because of
ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS:**

Go to www.mcmua.com or <http://twitter.com/morriscountynj> or call the Morris County MUA at 973-659-3490
Ext.: General Mail Box. If collection is cancelled you may either put your recyclables out at curbside the next scheduled collection day or take them to the Tanglewood Lane Recycling Depot.

If it's a **windy day**, put lids or heavier materials on top of the containers to prevent lighter materials from blowing away.

If it's **raining**, cover the containers with a lid. Also put **drain holes** in the bottom of container.

If your **trash and recyclables are collected on the same day or you use lids**, it's imperative that you label all containers properly to avoid confusion. **Decals** for trash and recycling containers are available at the public works department and at the municipal building. There is no cost for the decals.

Containers must have handles and be no larger than 32 gallons. Maximum weight for any container is 50 lbs.
Heavier than that will not be picked up.
