Dear Neighbor:

As part of Transcontinental Gas Pipe Line Company, LLC's (Transco's) commitment to maintain and operate a safe and reliable pipeline system and to comply with all U.S. Department of Transportation Pipeline Safety Regulations, Transco is currently planning work to replace pipe and valve setting on Mainline Caldwell B in Morris County, NJ. The existing valve is located within Transco's existing easement on property owned by the County of Morris, identified as Block 48.14, Lot 106 in the Township of Chatham. Transco will also be using workspace during construction on the adjacent property owned by PSE&G, identified as Block 48.14, Lot 107, also in the Township of Chatham. Both properties abut Southern Boulevard. An aerial drawing depicting the proposed construction workspace is enclosed.

This letter is to notify you of the planned work and to also give you an opportunity to ask questions regarding the pending work and access. The work is tentatively scheduled to begin the week of April 22, 2019. Transco anticipates completing the work by the end of June 2019. The construction itself will be limited to Transco's existing cleared permanent easement on the Morris County property. Since construction is limited to the existing cleared easement, no trees will be removed, although some side trimming may be necessary to allow access for certain construction equipment. Transco will also use temporary workspace within PSE&G's right-of-way (ROW) as a staging area and parking area for construction equipment. There are no trees being removed as the workspace is within PSE&G's previously disturbed ROW.

As an interstate natural gas transmission pipeline, Transco is regulated by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), and will complete this work in accordance with the provisions of the Blanket Certificate issued to Transco by FERC. This notice is provided pursuant to Section 157.203(d)(1) of the FERC's regulations.

Transco will make every effort to complete this work in an environmentally responsible manner. If you are not satisfied with the response, you may utilize the FERC's Dispute Resolution Service as explained below. All impacts to the area are expected to be temporary, and upon completion of the work the site will be returned to as near pre-project conditions as practicable. Transco's goal is to complete the planned activity with minimal impact to you, the community, and the environment. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation with our efforts to maintain our pipeline system in a safe and efficient manner possible.
